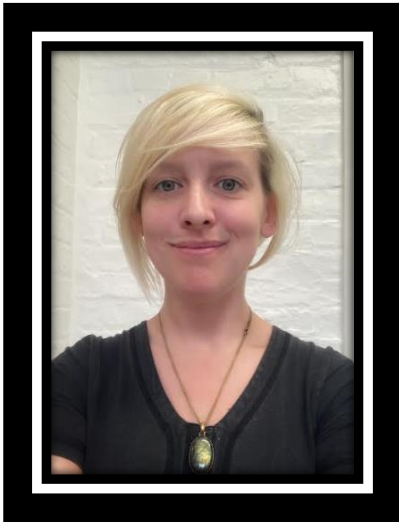

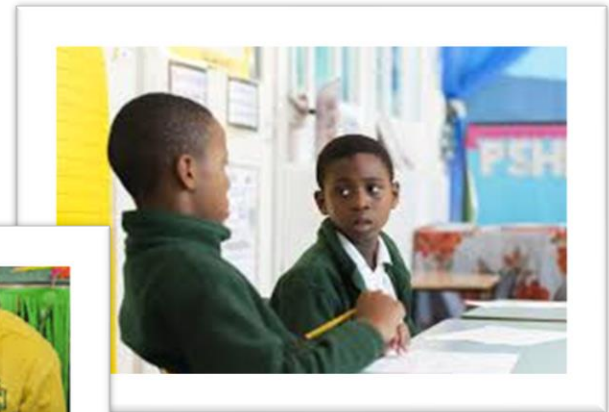

- ▶ Diary entry about life in Ancient Egypt

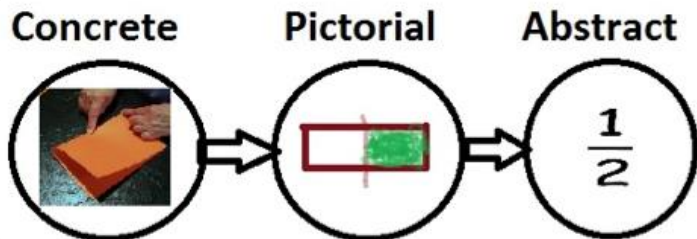
Curriculum for Autumn 1
