Exploring our Country



Curriculum Booklet Autumn Term 2022

Year 6

'This is Britain'

Our whole school curriculum theme for Autumn term is 'This is Britain'. Children will investigate significant historical events in British history. In Year 6, we will focus on the Anglo-Saxon and Viking eras, investigating the impact that these groups had on Britain. Children will investigate how we know about the past, particularly when out of living memory. They will learn about different sources such as artefacts, memories, photos and books, what we can learn from them and how reliable they might be.



Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education (PSHE)

This term we will revisit our school values (<u>C</u>harity, <u>O</u>penness, <u>L</u>ifelong Learners, <u>Y</u>ote, <u>E</u>nriching, <u>S</u>afety, <u>T</u>olerance, <u>O</u>rigins, <u>N</u>eighbourly, <u>E</u>quality) and explore what they look like in action and how we can demonstrate them in our various communities. We will explore the rules around social media, being able to

understand why these rules exist and understand what is appropriate and not appropriate to share online.

After half term, we will explore the influences and attitudes towards money how it effects individuals and the effects of money and financial risks.



English

Reading: This term we will continue to read a variety of text types. We will spend this term identifying how to successfully answer prediction, retrieval, summarising, evaluation and clarifying questions when reading.

Writing: We will study the use of language in a variety of genres, including historical narratives. We will learn about using adverbs, preposition phrases and expanded noun phrases effectively to add detail, qualification and precision to our writing.

Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar: We will recognise vocabulary and structures that are appropriate for formal speech and writing, including subjunctive forms. We will also use expanded noun phrases to convey information concisely. We will continue to work on our spelling through our reading and writing.





Number—this term we will learn about:

- Place value of integers and decimal numbers
- Rounding decimal numbers to the nearest whole number and tenth
- Accurate calculation strategies for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division

Children need to be fluent in times tables up to 12 x 12.

Fractions: Children will continue to develop their understanding of fractions, being able to add, subtract, divide and multiply proper fractions and mixed numbers.

Geometry and measurement: We will build on our knowledge, of reading coordinates, as well as being able to translate and reflect shapes.

Mental maths: Children will continue to enhance their mental strategies for all operations, instead of relying solely on written methods.

Topic

We will learn about British history and explore heritage by discussing a range of 'big questions'. These questions are designed to promote children's critical thinking and help them to investigate and analyse in order to identify facts.

- How do we know about the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings?
- Who were the Anglo-Saxons and why did they come to Britain?
- What can we learn from Sutton Hoo?
- How did Christianity change people's lives when it came to Britain?
- Does Alfred the Great deserve to be called 'Great'?
- 'The Vikings were just brutal savages who did no good' Is this your opinion?

Geography



Children will find out about physical and human features of the UK and discuss the origins of place names and their links to groups that invaded and/or settled in Britain. We will use primary and secondary sources of evidence to investigate. We will analyse evidence and draw

conclusions about its relevance and what it tells us about different geographical areas. To further develop geographical enquiry skills we will select maps for specific reasons and use atlases to find out about features of places.

Religious Education (RE)



This term we will continue to develop our understanding of religious beliefs and customs. We will be exploring Judaism and Buddhism. Our key questions will be 'What do Jews believe are their

responsibilities to God?' and 'How does being in a Buddhist community help Buddhists to follow to follow the Buddha's teachings?'

Science
